

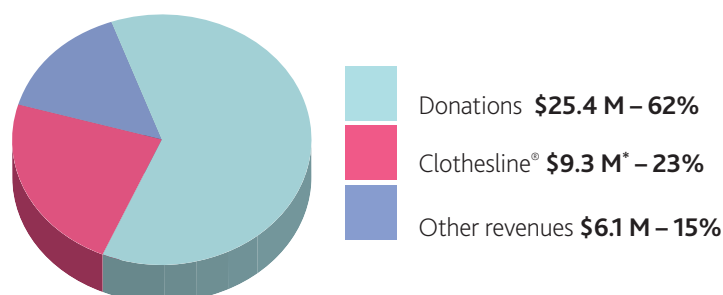
# Upholding your trust

### Sources of Funds Available for Programs and Research, Year Ended August 31, 2010

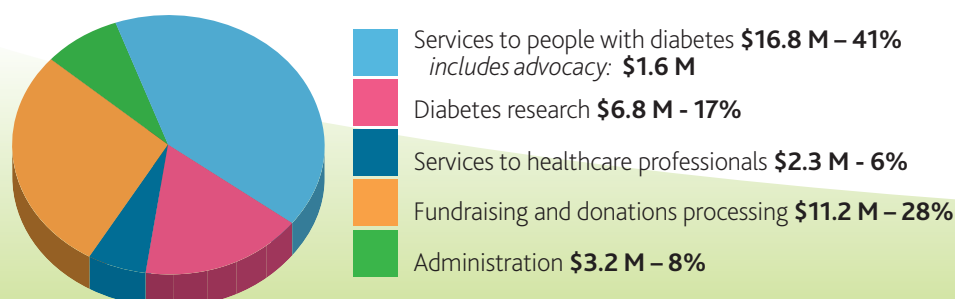


\* Clothesline® is our donated clothing and household item collection program and is shown on a fully allocated cost basis.
