Deductibles and co-payments	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Individuals & Families: \$250 deductible per person; maximum \$500 per family, then 100% coverage (deductible may be waived in cases of hardship). ➤ Seniors (>65) and spouses (>60): 100% coverage. ➤ Low income: Clients with diabetes covered by Chronic Disease Program: \$250 deductible, then 100% coverage (deductible may be waived in cases of hardship). ➤ Social assistance: Clients with diabetes covered by Chronic Disease program: 100% coverage.
Emergency assistance	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Nutritional supplements prescribed by a physician and with specific criteria met, may be covered.
Formulary status of diabetes drugs	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Listed: acarbose (Prandase) / gliclazide (Diamicron)/ glyburide / insulins (regular) / insulins aspart (NovoRapid) / metformin/ repaglinide (GlucoNorm)/ R glucagon ➤ Restricted: rosiglitazone (Avandia) – may be covered for patients who are not adequately controlled or who are intolerant to metformin and sulfonylureas / pioglitazone (Actos) ➤ Not listed: nateglinide (Starlix)
