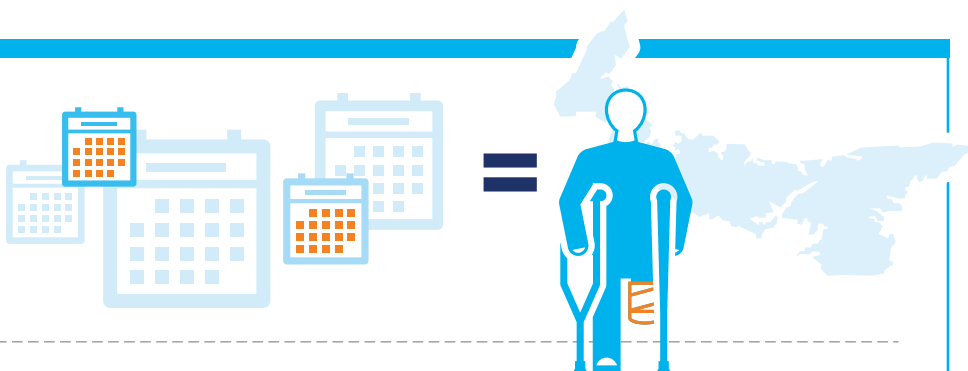


# Why action is needed to **prevent amputations** in Prince Edward Island

In Prince Edward Island, there is  
**1 amputation every 12 days**  
as a result of a diabetic foot ulcer



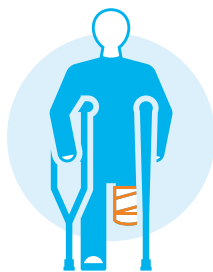
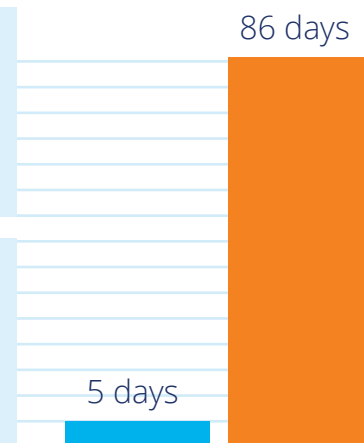
**In 2018, 15,000 people in PEI are living with diabetes**



**180 to 300** will have a diabetic foot ulcer

When an ulcer **leads to amputation:**  
**86 days** in the hospital, ER and clinics

When an ulcer **heals properly:**  
**5 days** in the hospital, ER and clinics



Nearly **31** will have an amputation below the knee

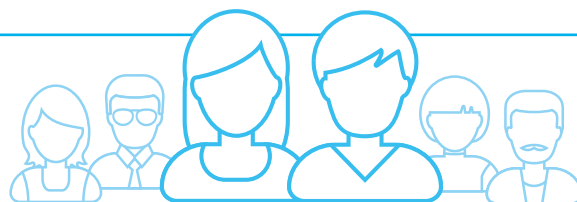
Direct health-care costs:

**Up to \$4.3 million a year**



**What can we do?** In addition to improved screening and foot care, increased government funding for specialized devices can help prevent amputations and save our health-care system up to **\$1.1 million a year.**

Ask the Government of PEI to take action for our health.
